Cancellation or detention of a Tug

- a) Where a tug order is postponed or cancelled with less than 2 hours notice a cancellation fee will apply.
- b) Where a ship fails to arrive or depart within 15 minutes after the ordered time a cancellation charge will apply. A new booking will then be required.
- c) Where a tug is detained for longer than the standard job time a detention fee will apply
