Dublin SafePort

By promoting a culture of safety, providing essential resources, and fostering collaboration with various agencies, SafePort aims to create a secure and supportive environment across the port. Dublin Port Pass

The Dublin Port Pass ensures all personnel accessing the port are equipped with essential health, safety, and security knowledge.

The Dublin Port Pass is a mandatory Health & Safety and Security induction introduced by Dublin Port Company to ensure safe and secure access to the North and South Port Common User Areas.



Accessible in multiple languages—English, Irish, Filipino, Polish, Romanian, and Russian—the Dublin Port Pass is required for Port Employees, Tenants, Agents, Stevedores, Linesmen, Contractors, Suppliers, Drivers, and Visitors. DUBLIN PORT PASS

No cycling within the Common User Area



Oil Zone Induction





Road Safety

Road safety is a top priority across the Dublin Port estate, ensuring a safe environment for everyone who drives, works, or travels within its boundaries. To promote safety, a strict 40km/h speed limit is enforced throughout the port, with a reduced limit of 20km/h in all terminal areas. These measures, combined with clear signage and ongoing awareness initiatives, help minimize risks and maintain a secure and efficient flow of traffic.

Mutual Aid Group - Oil & HNS Response Program
